THE SCHOOL OF RADIONICS is a self-regulating body governed by the Council of the Radionic Association. The objectives of the School are firstly to offer a training programme for those wishing to become Radionic Practitioners and secondly to provide introductory courses in radionics for all interested parties. Specialist post graduate courses are also provided.

INTRODUCTION TO RADIONICS

The School of Radionics offers an Introductory Weekend. This is designed to give newcomers the basic skills to help friends and family members using the radionic healing method from a distance wherever they live in the world.

Everyone is welcome on this course and it is also a requirement for all students planning to continue with further training to become a Qualified Practitioner.

It is necessary to be able to dowse before attending the Introductory Weekend. We offer regular short Dowsing courses or we can arrange individual training.

During the Introduction to Radionics participants will:

- Learn how to make a basic radionic analysis through dowsing
- Learn about radionic rates and their uses
- Be introduced to the subtle anatomy of the chakras and subtle bodies
- Look for basic underlying causes
- Perform simple treatments with an instrument
- Practise how to ground and protect themselves whilst working.
- The use of Bach Flower remedies and colour.

A Certificate of Attendance will be given to those attending this course. The course is designed to fulfil the criteria required by other complementary therapy disciplines for CPD (Continuing Professional Development).

An option for an extra tutorial is possible (at an extra fee) prior to commencing the Diploma Course.

DIPLOMA COURSE

This continues from the Introduction to Radionics course, and currently runs for a further three years and comprises:

1. Licentiate Module
2. Diploma Module

It is a requirement that students have a certificate of anatomy and physiology, which should be attained within the first year of training. Further information on these courses is available from the office. It is also a requirement to have the equivalent of four GCSEs including English.

All students, including overseas students, must attend the Introductory course and interview prior to commencing the Diploma course.

1. LICENTIATE MODULE of 3 terms (18 months)

This comprises three terms: Term 1 – Licentiate Analysis Stage (September - April), Term 2 - Licentiate Module 1 (April - September) and Term 3 - Licentiate Module 2 (September - April). Each term is approximately 6 months duration. The aim is to take students to a level where he/she can work professionally, but under supervision. During this time the student will have four individual tutorials per term. A tutor will be allocated as close to the student's home as possible or the tutorials can be by Zoom or Skype if the student lives abroad or too far from the nearest tutor.

Every six months two days' study sessions will be presented, either online or in person, when further topics will be introduced to deepen the understanding and scope of Radionics. It is essential that all students attend these sessions as part of the training.

Topics studied over this period will include:

Subtle anatomy work:

- Expanding the interpretation of the analysis
- Psychological aspects of the chakras
- Alta Major Chakra
- Expanding knowledge of the subtle bodies

Development of the student's range of radionic treatments:

- Full list of rates for systems and structures of the human body
- Accompanying list of conditions
- Bach Flower remedies
- Tissue salts
- Minerals
- Vitamins
- Colour
- Miasms – an introduction
- Treating with a Peggotty board
- Accidents and Emergencies

Personal Skills:

- Personal Development
- Running a practice
- Communication skills

Students will be required to submit one case study, a 2000-word essay and monthly diary sheets three weeks in advance of each Study Day for the first two modules. The first essay will be on 'The Subtle Anatomy of Man' and the second essay will be on 'Esoteric Healing' - What do you understand by the term 'Esoteric Healing'? Aim to give one or two examples taken from your practical work in radionics as well as discussing the theory behind the concept.

After 18 months of the Diploma Course students will be assessed for the award of **Licentiate of the Radionic Association**. All students should have treated a minimum of 10 different patients from the start of the Diploma course until one month before their assessment, and must have successfully completed an A&P course before applying for Licentiate of the Association.

Upon qualifying as a Licentiate, and under the supervision of a tutor, students may charge a fee to their patients. In this way income can be generated to support the continuation of their studies. The Licentiate award is valid for 2½ years during which time the student will be expected to complete the training.

It is important to note that those not wishing to continue training to diploma level and who wish to practise radionic treatment without being under the supervision of a school tutor need to arrange their own insurance cover at this stage.

2. DIPLOMA MODULE of 3 terms (18 months)

During the Diploma module, students will be introduced to wider aspects of radionics and philosophical issues to prepare them to work independently. This allows time to experience being a practitioner while still having the continued support of a tutor. Most students experience this period as one of personal growth.

There are three terms, each of approximately six months: Term 4 – Licentiate Assessment (April - September), Term 5 - Diploma Module 1 (September - April) and Term 6 - Diploma Module 2 (April - September). The students will be expected to have at least three individual tutorials in each term as well as attending the study days. Topics studied now will include:

Subtle anatomy work:

- Developmental ages of the chakras
- The Spleen and Splenic triangle
- A study of the Ethers
- Extended energy centres
- The Rays

The treatment repertoire is expanded to include:

- More flower essences
- Gems in Radionic practice
- Symbols, shapes and patterns
- Miasms in radionic practice – a deeper understanding
- Cranial nerves and the spine
- Pollution
- Terminal illness
- Mental Health
- Chronic Cases
- Radionic potentiating and homeopathic treatments
- Base 44 rates and treatments

Self-Development:

- Ethical and legal considerations
- Counselling skills
- Philosophy of healing and esoteric traditions
- Business Development and running a profitable practice.

It is important that Students have worked with 10 new cases since their Licentiate Assessment. The requirements for the final Diploma assessment are:

1. Two completed case studies

Case 1: Students may have already completed the first analysis on this case, so that they will have time for 2 rechecks at the very least. They will need to supply all the accompanying documents and feedback from the patient.

Case 2: The patient does not have to have been treated for as long but should show a good variety of treatments.

2. An essay (6,000 words)

The Essay, to be entitled 'My Understanding of Radionics', gives students a chance to express in words the main essence of radionics and how it appears to them. They might like to write about their personal journey and how they may have changed during the course as well as picking out some topics to focus on in more detail. These could include, for example, flower essences, tissue salts, instruments and rates, how disease originates, or many more. This is a time for students to review the last 3 years and find their own words to express the aspects that have most interested them during that time. It should be an enjoyable and worthwhile experience and will be an achievement in itself.

3. An interview

On successful completion of the course students will be awarded a Diploma.

They will then be invited to enrol as a full Member of the Radionic Association. The Association serves as the professional organisation for its Qualified Radionic Practitioners. It is a valuable resource for support and information. It also provides Professional Indemnity Insurance.

INSTRUCTORS AND TUTORS

The Radionic Association prides itself on the quality and experience of its practitioners who, as tutors, during the training course offer their individual skills in respect of the varied types of therapies that are involved in learning to become a fully competent Radionic Practitioner.

FEES

These are charged per term and payable in advance. The fees will be set at the beginning of the course and will remain constant throughout the course.

In addition to paying fees for tuition and study days, students must also purchase instruments and a number of books and pay any travel expenses.

SOIL AND CROPS

A separate professional course on the treatment of Soil and Crops is planned for the future. Please apply to the office of the Radionic Association for further details.
